3-1-1 curbside confusion

The city offers free, on-call curbside pick up for large items (think refrigerators, furniture), loose brush, and bagged yard trash. The key to quick service is making the correct pickup request. Each type of trash requires a separate pickup request, because a different truck picks up different items and takes them to different places. That means you can't mix bagged and loose stuff in the same pile.

First, either call 3-1-1 or go to Chattanooga.gov and click on the red 3-1-1 symbol at the bottom of the page. Then click on the type of pickup you need. If your items have not been picked up within a week (it's usually within two days), most likely you've made a mistake. Call 3-1-1 or go online for detailed instructions.
