## de-annexation update

From The Tennessean, Feb 10, 2017:

"State Sen. Bo Watson, R-Hixson, and Rep. Mike Carter, R-Ooltewah, are bringing back legislation that would allow voters to determine if they would like to leave cities such as Memphis, Knoxville, Chattanooga, and others across the state. It's a process known as de-annexation.

"Under the proposed legislation, a minimum 20 percent of the residents in the affected area would need to submit a petition to include the de-annexation on the next election ballot. The ballot would include a choice to be for or against de-annexation, according to the legislation.

"But one of the biggest sticking points in the debate between the state and cities is the financial implications. According to the legislation, the residents who do vote to


## ladies who lunch
